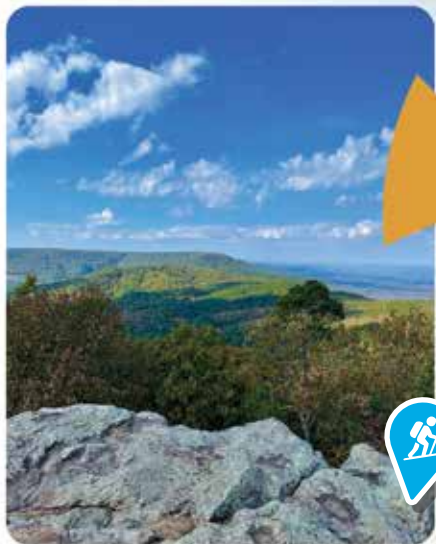

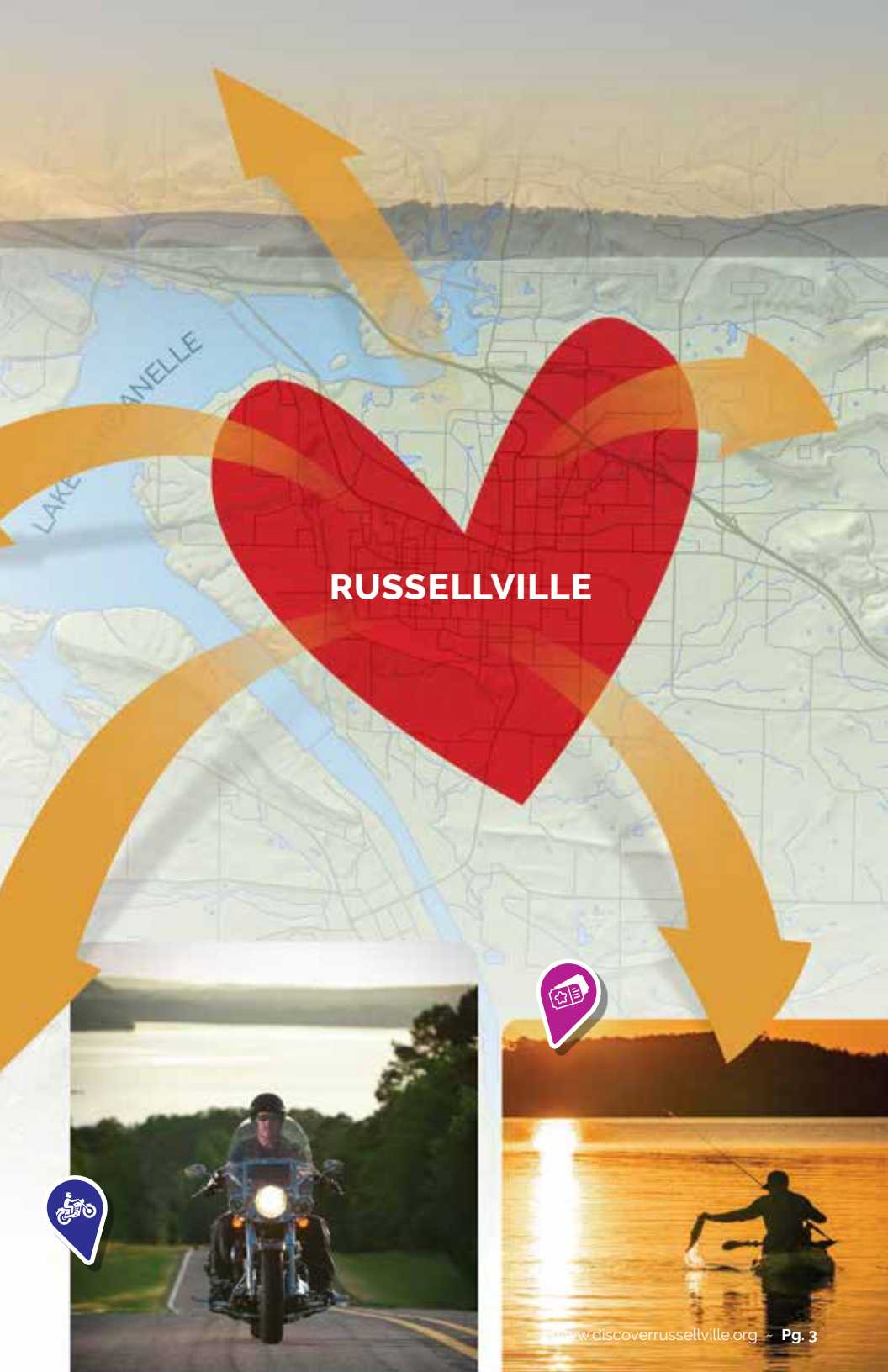

Located within an hour's drive from Petit Jean, Mount Nebo, Mount Magazine and the Ozarks, and home of Lake Dardanelle off of the Arkansas River, Russellville is where you stay to play, whether it's on or off the beaten path.

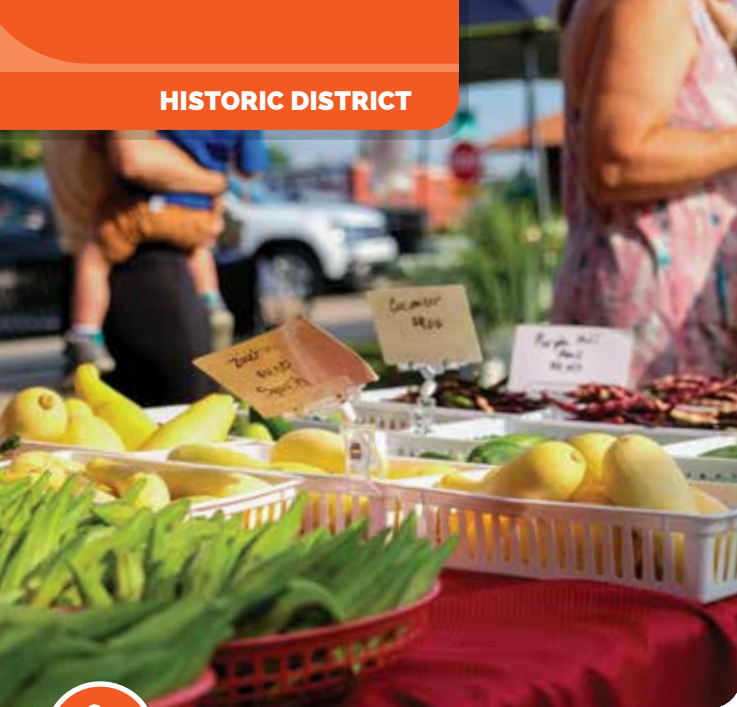

Take a Stroll

Downtown

Make your first step one back in time at the preserved 1917 train depot.

The clickety-clack of a train on the tracks represents the heartbeat of commerce that drove Russellville to be the county seat in 1887. Stroll through for a bit of history, and sit on a bench out front to plan your time in the downtown.

With great efforts taken in historic preservation and mindful renovation, the downtown is the place to appreciate the architectural details, while dining and shopping. Enjoy superb barbecue that hits

the spot; rich Italian fare; gourmet pizza at the local brewery; beverages, bingo and a live band at a restored bank, or blow the train whistle after a custom sandwich and piece of pie in an authentic train car. Take a stroll after a great meal and enjoy the sights and sounds of Russellville's designated entertainment district.





There's something for all shoppers, whether it's boutique clothing for children or adults, fan gear to support the local teams, or outdoor gear for upcoming adventures that draws your attention, you'll find it downtown. Need a great book and a cup of coffee to decompress? You'll find those, too, plus many more unique small businesses.

A hub for the arts, downtown is host to events throughout the month, with concerts and art walks, as well as several art galleries. Scan the QR code for a list of upcoming events in the downtown.

In the Parks

If nature tugs at your heartstrings, the Russellville area is the place for you.

Visit one of the many city parks for walking paths, disc golf, pickleball, golf, basketball, tennis or a playground for the kids.

Nestled in the Arkansas River Valley, Russellville is the home to Lake Dardanelle, where there's world renowned bass fishing, boating, skiing, kayaking and swimming. If up-hill is where you are headed, visit one of the three mountainous state parks nearby for hiking, hang-gliding, rock-climbing and mountain biking.

There's something for everyone of all skill levels in the great outdoors of and around Russellville!

City Parks

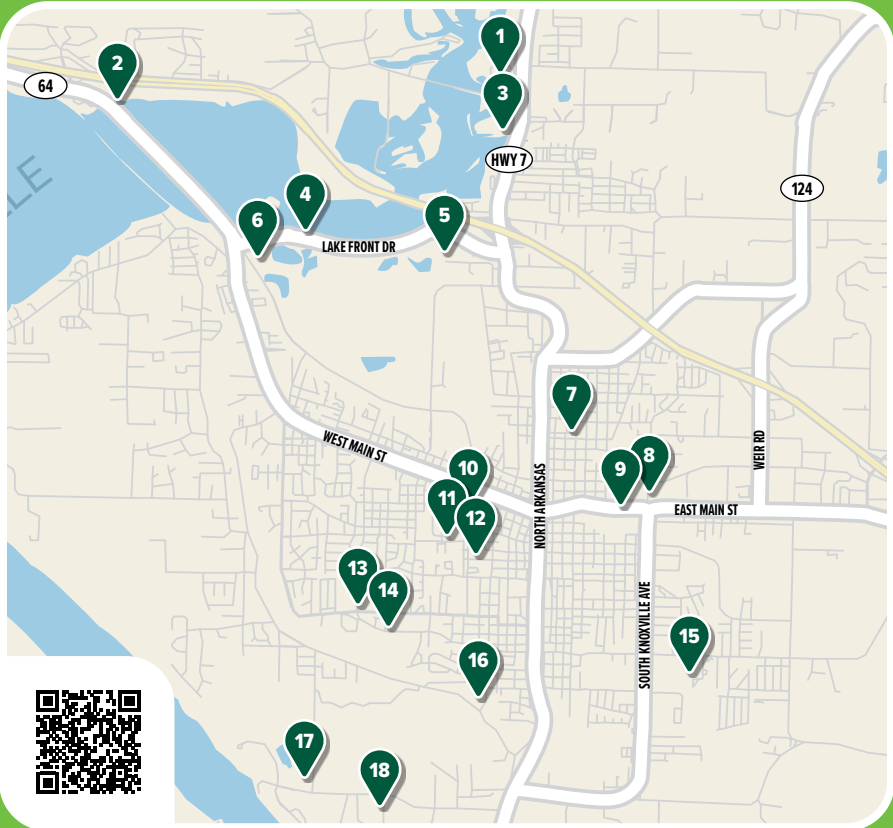
For something to appeal to all ages, visit one of the city parks with modern playground equipment and picnic areas. City, Old Post Road, Crawford, James School, Pleasant View, Russellville Soccer Complex, Shiloah or Washburn Parks are all designed with the youth in mind.

If a leisurely stroll through nature is your pace, visit Bona Dea trail system, located on 186 acres of protected wetland habitat. Six miles of trails wind through trees and alongside swamp. With a watchful eye, visitors will see local wildlife, and a possible sighting of the local alligator that claims Bona Dea as its home! Also including notable trails are Confederate Mother's Memorial Park, Dike View Park, Pleasant View Park, the Russellville Soccer Complex and Veteran's Memorial Park.

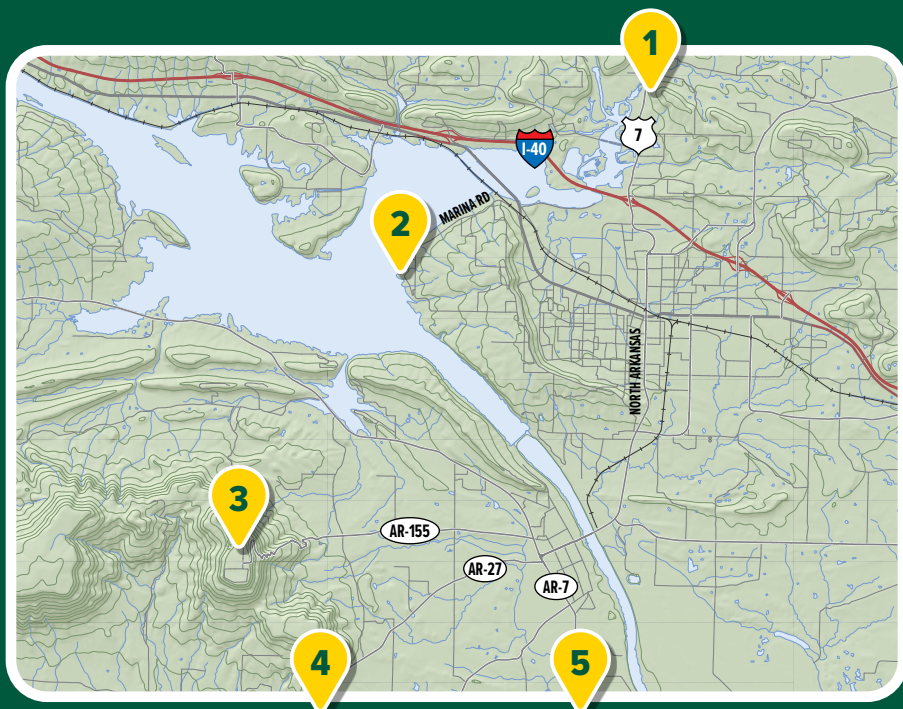

STATE PARKS MAP



1. THE OZARKS



DIRECTIONS: Take N. Arkansas from Main St. Drive north to Dover & turn left at the T on Highway 7. You are now at the foothills of the Ozarks. Just keep driving.

2. LAKE DARDANELLE



DIRECTIONS: Travel west on Main St. Turn left at the light on Marina Road. Follow signs to Lake Dardanelle Visitors Center, on the right.

3. MOUNT NEBO



DIRECTIONS: Take S. Arkansas Ave. from Main St. Travel thru Dardanelle to the "T", & turn right on AR-22. In .3 miles, turn left on AR-155. The road ends atop Mt. Nebo.

4. MOUNT MAGAZINE



DIRECTIONS: Take S. Arkansas Ave. from Main St. Travel thru Dardanelle to the "T", & turn left onto AR-7. In 400 ft, turn right onto AR-27. Travel 18 miles & turn right onto AR-10. In 8.4 miles, turn right onto N. Main. In ten miles, turn left & the destination will be on the right.

5. PETIT JEAN MOUNTAIN



DIRECTIONS: Take S. Arkansas Ave. from Main St. Travel through Dardanelle to the "T", & turn left on AR-7. In 1.6 miles, turn left onto AR-155. In 7.6 miles, turn left onto AR-154. This road will drive through the park in 8.5 miles.

For a little competition, City, Old Post Road, and Shiloah parks are your destination for basketball and tennis, with James School and Crawford both having basketball. For professional level 18-hole disc golf, play the Pleasant View and Old Post Road park courses.

The city also maintains two swimming facilities if you need to cool off after a day outdoors: Hickey Pool for outdoor and Russellville Aquatic Center for indoor. If casting a line is on your mind, there are boat ramps at Washburn and Illinois Bayou parks, and shaded bank fishing at Pleasant View park. With 23 parks in Russellville, pick one and go outside to play!



State Parks

With 52 state parks in the Natural State, Russellville is nestled in the center of three and houses one. Scenic drives and adventure are calling. Reach for the clouds or dip in the lake, Russellville is your hub!

LAKE DARDANELLE STATE PARK

Right here in Russellville, Lake Dardanelle State Park offers a great place to pitch a tent or park a camper in one of its 57 campsites, or to visit for a day.

With five indoor aquariums, the visitor’s center is a welcoming spot to take a break from activities and learn about some of the native species, as well as the area’s history

through displays. Lake Dardanelle State Park is a certified Trail of Tears National Historic Site, and was a popular stop between Little Rock and Fort Smith during the time of removal.

On the grounds, park interpreters lead programs and lake tours, while picnic facilities, boat rental and ramps, swimming and fishing areas, and pavilions and playgrounds offer further outdoor opportunities.

MOUNT NEBO STATE PARK

Located roughly ten miles from the center of Russellville, Mount Nebo State Park is rich in history, with many of the facilities built by the 1930s Civilian Conservation Corps and having been a popular vacation destination prior to that, dating back to the 1800s. Mount Nebo State Park is also a certified Trail of Tears National Historic Trail Site.

Containing more than 25 miles of hiking and mountain biking trails, a swimming pool, tennis courts, picnic areas, pavilions, and a visitor's center with a gift shop, there's plenty to do to entertain

all. If there's too much on the agenda to allocate an entire day, make the trip for a spectacular sunrise or sunset view, second to none, and enjoy watching the deer meander about, at Mount Nebo State Park.

PETIT JEAN STATE PARK

Approximately 30 minutes from the center of Russellville, Petit Jean was Arkansas's first state park. It is the home of 95-foot



Cedar Falls, Seven Hollows Trail, Bear Cave, the Grotto, Natural Bridge, and other formations like carpet rocks and turtle rocks. Stop at the visitor's center for maps and program schedules.

The Civilian Conservation Corps began construction in 1933, with trails, roads, bridges (including the notable stone Davies Bridge), cabins, and the focal point of the park: historic Mather Lodge with a restaurant, meeting rooms, and gift shop overlooking Cedar Creek Canyon. Two swimming pools, picnic areas, playgrounds, pavilions, boat launch ramp, tennis and basketball courts, and an amphitheater are also on site.

Also within the park, Lake Bailey provides 100 acres for fishing, kayaking, and pedal boating. Open in the summer months, the boathouse offers a snack bar, boat rentals, and supplies. Petit Jean State Park is a certified Trail of Tears National Historic Trail Site.

Not a part of the park but worth a detour, The Museum of Automobiles is located nearby and features 50 notable antique automobiles and other unique collections,

housed in a structural marvel listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Also nearby is Barnyard Friends and Stables for a petting zoo and horseback riding.

MOUNT MAGAZINE

A part of the Ozark-St. Francis National Forests and boasting the highest peak in the state at 2,753 ft, Mount Magazine is located just under an hour's drive from Russellville.

Mount Magazine is the state park system's most dramatic location for technical rock climbing and also offers hang gliding launch areas. For a somewhat less extreme experience, it also offers mountain biking, horseback and ATV riding and hiking trails. Picnic areas, a pavilion and a visitor's center with a gift shop and restaurant add to the amenities.



THE OZARKS

While not a state park, but an outdoor mecca nonetheless, the Ozarks earn a mention. Floating the Buffalo river, hiking one of the many trails, or spelunking, the Ozarks have it all in regards to untamed mountainous outdoors experiences. Travel from one to two hours for forests and flowing water, north on Highway 7 from Russellville Arkansas.

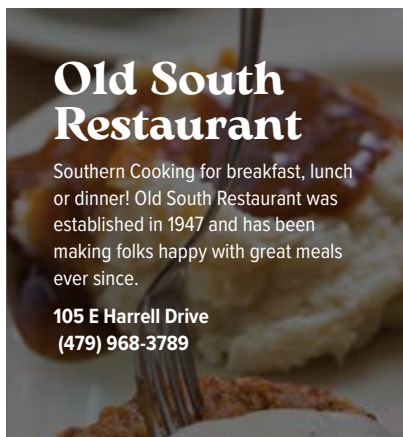

8. **THE CENTER FOR THE ARTS:** A multi-purpose 130,000 square foot facility capable of seating 1,875 guests, The Center for the Arts hosts district events and activities, as well as performing artist series and world class entertainment bringing in top name performers and Broadway shows. 2209 South Knoxville Ave.; www.russellvillecenter.net; (479) 498-6600

9. **LAKE DARDANELLE STATE PARK VISITOR CENTER:** Overlooking the lake, the center has engaging interactive exhibits and state-of-the-art touch screen kiosks that share information about the park, the area's water sources and rich history. An aquatic exhibit features four aquariums containing fish found in area waterways. (479) 967-5516.



10. **RIVER VALLEY ARTS CENTER:** With a gallery displaying 40 exhibitions annually of local, regional, national and international artists, this nonprofit community organization offers summer musical theatre and art camps, along with art, drama, and music classes for all age groups and abilities. On-site gift shop. 1001 East B St., Russellville; www.arvartscenter.org; (479) 968-2452.
11. **POTTS INN:** The Potts Inn Museum is one of the most well-preserved stagecoach stations on the Butterfield Overland mail route between Memphis and Fort Smith. The 1850s antebellum home also shares the grounds with a doll museum, doctor's museum, clothing collections and barn with antique farm equipment, all included in the tour. Potts Inn Museum, 25 East Ash St., Pottsville, AR. (479) 968-8369.

12. **ARKANSAS RIVER VISITOR CENTER:** The Visitor Center offers wildlife exhibits and an interpretive presentation chronicling the development of the Arkansas River. The center overlook is the perfect location to watch barges pass through the Lock and Dam below. Off of AR Hwy. 7, 1598 Lock & Dam Road, Russellville; managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. (479) 968-5008.
13. **HISTORIC MISSOURI PACIFIC RAILROAD DEPOT:** The Russellville Depot was built in 1916 and rededicated in 2004 following completion of a two-year rehabilitation project. The depot houses a visitor center, railroad museum, community room and the office of Main Street Russellville. The location and the adjacent Depot Park serve as home base for festivals and special events. (479) 967-1437.

14. **MUSEUM OF AUTOMOBILES:** A project by Winthrop Rockefeller, the museum was constructed in 1964 on Petit Jean Mountain, to exhibit a 33-car collection. Now with more than fifty vehicles on display, the exhibits also include an antique gun collection, a display of Arkansas license plates, and a player piano. (501) 727-5427; www.museumofautos.com.
15. **SUBIACO ABBEY:** Established in 1878 as a Benedictine Monastery, the abbey serves as a college preparatory school for boys. Pick up a brochure on-site for a self-guided tour to view the dramatic stone architecture and manicured grounds on Scenic AR Hwy 22 southwest of Russellville. (479) 934-1000.

16. **RUSSELLVILLE CHRISTMAS PARADE:** This annual parade is a local holiday tradition held on the first Thursday of December. The event attracts thousands and is believed to be the largest lit parade in Arkansas. (479) 968-1272.
17. **SUMMER CONCERT SERIES:** Main Street Russellville's summer concert series features local and regional talent at Depot Park in Russellville Downtown! Bring your blankets and lawn chairs throughout the summer for a special treat. (479) 967-1437.





18. **POPE COUNTY FAIR:** Nothing beats the smell of a corn dog and cotton candy at the Pope County Fair. Since 1941, the fair has been an annual tradition in Pope County for more than 65 years. Visit the arts, crafts and livestock displays and enjoy the fun, food and amusement rides each September. Pope County Fair Association, (479) 967-0320; www.popecountyfairarkansas.com.
19. **FALL FESTIVAL & CHILI COOK-OFF:** A fun-filled, day-long street festival held each year on the last Saturday in October. The event, sponsored by Main Street Russellville, is held in Downtown Russellville and is centered around the Historic Missouri-Pacific Railroad Depot and Depot Park. (479) 967-1437.
20. **PICKLE FEST IN ATKINS:** In 1945, Goldsmith Pickle Company invested \$75,000 to build a pickle plant in town, while townspeople raised an additional \$15,000 to equip the plant that became the Atkins Pickle Company. The plant sustained the local economy for more than half a century. Pickle Fest honors the pickle with Mr. Dill Pickle & Miss Sweet Pickle pageants, pickle juice drinking, pickle eating contests and more. Always held the third weekend in May.
21. **POPE COUNTY FARMERS MARKET:** The Pope County Farmers Market services the Russellville area, with fresh, locally-grown produce, meats, honey, and eggs, and locally-made baked goods, crafts and more. 22. **MISTLETOE MARKET:**

Shop for a Cause at this annual holiday shopping extravaganza benefiting the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Arkansas River Valley, 600 E. 16th St., (479) 968-7819.

23. **QUARTERLY ARTWALK:**

Join the fun as this event brings together visitors, musicians and merchants in Historic Downtown Russellville. Shop, Dine, Discover the fun. For dates and times, visit: www.mainstreetrussellville.org or call (479) 967-1437.



Outdoor Activities

24. **PETIT JEAN STATE PARK:**

Waterfalls, lakes, mountainsides, meadows and 21 miles of hiking trails can be found at Arkansas's first and flagship state park. Located approximately 30 minutes from Russellville. (501) 727-5441; www.petitjeanstatepark.com.

25. **MT. MAGAZINE STATE PARK:** For a breathtaking view atop the highest point in Arkansas, visit Mt. Magazine State Park. Reservations may be made at the park's magnificent 60-room lodge or one of the 13 cabins. Located on Scenic Highway 309, 43 miles southwest of Russellville. www.mountmagazine.com. 26. **MT. NEBO STATE PARK:** Enjoy the sweeping views of the Arkansas River at sunrise or sunset, or hike/bike 25 miles of winding trails situated 1,350 feet above the River Valley. Mt. Nebo State Park is one of two Arkansas State Parks offering launch sites for hang gliding enthusiasts. Campsites and cabins available. www.mountnebo.com (479) 229-3655.
27. **BONA DEA TRAILS:** If trails or biking are your style, the Bona Dea Trails and Sanctuary is a must. More than 186 acres and 5.5 miles of trails and wetlands and wooded lowlands provide a perfect habitat for 200 species of birds. (479) 968-5008.
28. **OZARK MOUNTAINS AND BUFFALO NATIONAL RIVER:** Starting in early October and running through the middle of November, the mountain's sights along Hwy 7 explode with vibrant fall colors. The Buffalo National River is the country's first national river with 95,000 acres of public land along its corridor. Hidden nearby are natural springs, caves, waterfalls, natural bridges, and box-like canyons.
29. **BIG PINEY:** Want adventure? Canoe the Big Piney Creek nestled in the heart of the Ozarks. Contact Moore Outdoors for water levels, rates, or to make reservations for a great outdoor outing on one of Arkansas's best waterways. (479) 331-3606; www.mooreoutdoors.com.
30. **HOLLA BEND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT:** Established to provide essential habitat for migratory birds in the Mississippi Flyway, this area has over 7,000 acres of agricultural fields, bottomlands, forest and open water. Home to several species of ducks, bald eagles, Canadian geese and other wildlife throughout the year. 10448 Holla Bend Rd., Dardanelle, (479) 229-4300.

31. **MOUNTAIN BIKING OUITA COAL COMPANY AND OLD POST PARK:** Maintained by the River Valley Chapter of the Ozark Off-Road Cyclists Club, Ouita Coal Company Trail is a nine-mile, single track lollipop trail system. It's a great stopover for riders heading south to the Ouachitas or north to the trail playgrounds in Bentonville. Old Post is a "fast, flowy trail near the banks of the Arkansas River" for any level of riding ability. Riders can make a full day of Old Post Park: eight miles of singletrack, an 18-hole professional disc golf course, tennis, basketball and volleyball courts decorate this Corp of Engineers owned park.
32. **MONUMENT TRAIL AT MT. NEBO:** This 25 mile Monument Trail system has something for everyone, including spectacular views, waterfalls, pine forests, winding rock gardens, and gravity – down and up.
